7. Dudley Park Project Group Report – Zack & Ruby

At the last Dudley Park Project Group meeting they had discussions if plan still fit for purpose, how to activate the space, what to do next and how to fund. Deck and mural have been completed,

plus added wheelchair access for deck. Agreed, the next step is the mounded seating area. This is estimated to be about \$20,000, firm quotes are to be sourced once resolution approved. Dudley Park group had researched options through "Give-Us" funding database for options for this project. Group decided to go with funders that don't generate income from gambling and therefore would like to apply to Rātā Foundation (explained who Rātā are and objectives and background).

Previous work for decking and mural cost approx. \$50,000 and were funded through Aotearoa Gaming Trust, Waimakariri District Council, McAlpine's (supplied timber) and Waghorn Builders (labour provided).

Youth Council have 15 members plus 3 Councillors, total 18, and the Quorum is 50% of the group, so 9 need to be present to be able to vote, make decisions, resolutions etc. Present at this meeting is 9, thus quorum met.

Funding Resolution: – To apply to Rātā Foundation for up to \$20,000 +gst for mounded seating at Dudley Park Project.

8. Environmental Group - Abbie

River Clean up group hasn't met since the last Youth Council Group meeting.

They had Ruby Gill-Clifford from Waimakariri WaterZone Committee come and talk about what that groups do. Also informing Youth Council members that Ruby currently holds the youth position for the Committee, so beware that there could be a position available in the future. Waterzone run monthly meetings and organise funding to assist other community groups to complete waterways related activities, such as planting or regeneration, clean up etc. Youth Council could apply to them to assist with a project.

Also went through the Kia Rite Hoea, (from the event planning course) and reviewed the worksheets and what the community may need (outside of river clean-up).

9. WaiYouth - Simoné

14. Long Term Plan (LTP) update - Emily

Ruby spoke to the Councillors at the hearing about the Youth Council submission. Nothing extra needed to be included. But Ruby highlighted a few points and provided more context around the survey. They did ask some questions about submission. Grant McLoed was going to review about Boccia Courts. Councillors review submission, then hear those that want to speak to group. Then they need to review everything again and then as a group then they discuss all the submissions, fully consider and make decisions. Councillors have finished last week; we should hear back from Council in next few weeks. Only action from Youth Council was about the Boccia courts. Migrant Group & the Welcoming communities team want to pass on their thanks to the Youth Council for your work in the Survey and the submission to the LTP. Your Survey has revealed that 30% of youth have identified that racism is an issue (one of the top 4 issues for Youth). This

provides evidence that this is an issue and that our community needs to do more. This can help to influence decisions that the council make, not just in LTP but in actions the council takes or where funding is allocated.

15. Festival for the Future in Wellington

Festival for the Future –16, 17 & 18 July 2024. Young people conference (approx. 2,000), with opportunities for connecting with Mayor of Wellington (formal lunch), social networking with other Youth Councils across NZ. Attend other workshops & hear from different speakers. Previously had a political debate (election year) and Expo Space for community groups and organisations. Interactive activities. Great opportunity to see what other Youth Councils across NZ are doing to improve their communities. Try to go to workshops that interest you but also cover them all so that you can report back/debrief YC on your return.

We are lucky that Council is fully funding this, as other groups have to pay their own way. Emily has sent out the application form. Please have it back by Tuesday if you want to apply. In the past 2 YC members sent plus Emily, but we have potential to send more, so if interested, then apply. We will start with those who have been with YC for more than one year. If not enough keen, will open to newer members. Emily will not be going this year as she is away – Elizabeth will be going instead. There is an expectation that you will stay at the Conference and not leave.
